- System of Play:** The Tournament will be conducted as per FIDE Laws of Chess and FIDE Swiss System with 9 Rounds. All players will be playing together
- Reporting Time:** All players should Report at 8.30 am. Tournament will start at 9.00 am.
- Time Control:** 15 Minutes + 5 Seconds increment from move 1 for entire game.
- Tie Break:** 1. Buchholz Cut-1, 2. Buchholz, 3. SB 4. Direct Encounter, 5. Greater Number of wins (forfeit included), 6. Greater number of wins with black.
- AICF Registration:** Mandatory for the financial year 2024-2025 for players willing to participate.
- MCA Registration:** Mandatory for the financial year 2024-2025 for all Maharashtra players
