SHRI. RAMESH VINAYAKRAO KOTWAL

Shri Ramesh Vinayakrao Kotwal was born on 17th March, 1932, in an affluent family at Gondia. Shri Ramesh Vinayakrao Kotwal was a son of a renowned lawyer father and learned, dynamic teacher mother. After his graduation he was in the teaching profession for a few years, and then he started an independent business of Nabhovani Radio and Services.

During this tenure of entrepreneurship, he was also actively involved in Social Service. He had immense knowledge about law. Countless needy people would approach him for prudent legal advice. He was righteous and intolerant to injustice. Being the vice president of Jana sangha for the Gondia District, he was arrested during Emergency in 1977 and was sent to the political prison for a period of 14 months. It was during this sentence that he was transferred to Nashik and subsequently to Nagpur where he was first introduced to chess and developed a liking for it.

On Returning back he actively started teaching Chess to his family, resulting in a Chess driven atmosphere at home. His daughters Vidula and Archana developed a special interest in the game and went on to participate and win laurels at District level, state level and national level Chess competitions.

One of his daughters, Archana was selected for the prestigious World Under 16 Chess Tournament held at France in 1984 and took pride in representing our country. In 1991, Archana was also awarded the most prestigious award for sports by Maharashtra Government "Shri. Shiv Chhatrapati Award" with various other eminent sportsmen like Sachin Tendulkar. It is due to his Sacrifice and encouragement his daughter could achieve such great strides of success. He provided all-round support to his daughters in spite of financial difficulties involved while pursuing the game.

He had developed a true affection towards chess and he strove hard to ensure that Chess should be played by common man as well. He not only encouraged his daughters but also motivated the children in his locality to play chess. He used to sponsor the children and always tried to have maximum participation. He strove hard to spread the awareness and the development of chess in the new district of Gondia. It was his deep desire that maximum number of chess participants should emerge from a small and less known town of Gondia and play at state and national level so that Gondia makes it mark on national and global level.

On 25th December, 2012 he breathed his last and left for his heavenly abode.

Considering his love and affection for chess during his life time, in 2015 Dr. Nitin Chandrashekhar Kotwal has taken initiative and started in his memorial an All-India Open FIDE rating Chess tournament.

A WORD FROM HIS DAUGHTERS



During the period when emergency was declared in India, baba was sent to jail as a political prisoner. When he returned, he bought back with him the game of chess and that is how it all started. I don't remember how we learned it all but we used to watch him play and picked up bits and pieces along the way. Baba & Aai used to play 1 game every day and we began interjecting our own



ideas as we learned. The first tournament Archana played, she must be no older than 12 or 13, back then I preferred playing at home and had not started competing in tournaments. The year Archana entered her 12th grade, she decided that she would not be participating in tournaments to focus on her studies. Coincidentally, the National B women's tournament was taking place in Nagpur that year. There were to 2 spots for entries from the Vidarbha region and so they encouraged me to compete. I secured first rank in that tournament and got my first opportunity to play at a national level! After that victory I participated in all upcoming tournaments with Archana but I would often find the preparation from chess quite tiring and hence could not progress much. However, chess gave me an opportunity to travel, to make countless friends and help me build my concentration that in turn helped my studies. Everything that I achieved in chess was only possible because of baba's support and encouragement. Which is why I believe he holds the biggest part of all my success. He always stood firmly by us and time and again gave us important lessons on life that guide us even today.

A WORD FROM HIS DAUGHTERS


ARCHANA BENDRE
