System of Play:	The Tournament will be conducted as per FIDE Laws of Chess and FIDE Swiss System with 11 Rounds. All players will be playing together
Reporting Time:	All players should report at 9.45 AM. Tournament will start at 10.00 AM.
Walk over Time:	30 Minutes. After which the opponent will be given a bye
Time Control:	90 Minutes + 30 Seconds increment from move one for the entire game.
Tie Break:	1. Buchholz Cut-1, 2. Buchholz, 3. SB 4. Direct Encounter, 5. Greater Number of wins (forfeit included), 6. Greater number of wins with black.
AICF Registration:	Valid AICF ID required before the start of the first round
MCA Registration:	For all Maharashtra players a valid MCA ID is required before the start of the first round
Entry fees	(Free for GMs, IMs, WGMs, WIMs) Late charges of ₹300 for entries made after 01.05.2026

Prize:	Prizes shall not be shared. One player gets one higher prize. Cash prize is higher than trophy and Medal.
Cancellation Policy	100% refund for any cancellations done before 01.05.2026
Protest:	Any protest against the decision of chief arbiter shall be made in the writing with the fee of Rs. 1000 within the 15 minutes of incident. Protest fee will be refunded if the appeal is upheld. The decision of appeals committee is final and binding to all.
Appeals Committee:	A 5-member Appeals Committee (with 2 reserve) will be formed during the Players' meeting before the start of event.

Ramabai Ranade (25 January 1862 – 25 January 1924) was an Indian social worker and one of the first women's rights activists in the early 20th century. Her life was marked by tireless efforts to empower women and promote education. Ramabai faced the prevailing taboo against educating girls. In 1884, Ramabai, along with her husband and colleagues, established one of India's first girls' high schools, Huzurpaga, in Pune.
